World Civilization I

3 credits

Beginning with the creation of the world this course travels through the earliest beginnings of humans on the planet in prehistoric times and ends with the historical time of the Middle Ages in Europe and the parallel events in Asia and Africa. Classes attempt to introduce students to the earliest civilizations and all the aspects of culture as they unfold over time. Emphasis is placed on the developments in multiple areas of culture, especially the origins of the major religions of today: Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, and Buddhism.

General Psychology

3 credits

This is a basic course in the history, theories, principles, and methods of the psychological study of human behavior. Topics will include a brief history of psychology, critical thinking, human development, motivation, emotion and stress, personality, social psychology, and psychopathology as examined through the biopsychosocial perspective.

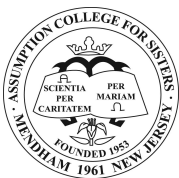

Special Topics in Theology - Christian Ethics

3 credits

Christian Ethics deals with the rightness and wrongness of human actions. The determinations made are based in conscience guided by principles which are derived using various methodological approaches such as deontology, proportionality or virtue ethics. Importance in this course will be given to the application of principles to various issues of justice such as peace and war, life issues including capital punishment, abortion, and ecology and bioethical issues of consent, distribution of resources and intervention in care. As a course of Christian Ethics, the principles examined will be considered in view of Gospel mandates and the Judeo-Christian ethos of social justice. The scholars used will be both from the foundations of Western philosophy and those of the Christian tradition.

Dropping:

Withdrawal/Drop prior to first day of semester class = 100% refund

Withdrawal during 1st week of class = 75% refund

Withdrawal during 2nd week of class = 50% refund

Withdrawal during 3rd week of class = 25% refund

Withdrawal after the 3rd week of class = 0% refund

Once class has started, if a student drops a class, they receive a W on their record for that class.

After the 4th week of class, if a student drops a class, they receive an F for that class.

a student must discuss the drop with the academic dean, who then submits the paperwork to drop the class to the registrar's office.

Adding:

A student can only add a class during the first week. They can add a class after that first week, but with permission from the Academic Dean. This is not encouraged and is determined on a case by case basis.

Eligibility:

Students entering into their senior year must have a B average and the written approval of their guidance counselor.

Anyone who is a high school graduate is eligible to take courses.

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
