### ACS Graduation... finally!

May 9 was the intended date for 8 Sister students from Assumption College for Sisters, Denville, to receive their diplomas. However, due to the events associated with the pandemic, that aspect had been postponed to a later date.

Despite the unprecedented times, the College administration did not want the day to go unnoticed. As a special surprise, Faculty, Staff, Board of Trustees, several Denville and Mendham friends formed a special congratulations parade. The Mayor Tom Andes of Denville, a parishioner of St. Mary's, Denville, enlisted the police and fire department. Over 40 cars decorated with signs and balloons joined the car parade, led by Denville Chief of Police and concluded with Denville Fire Department and Denville Emergency squad. No one was allowed out of his/her vehicle in order to maintain social distancing.

Graduates and Sister residents of the College lined the sidewalk carrying signs with each graduate's name and special Class of 2020 masks all designed by the resident Sisters.

Each year during commencement a member of the graduating class shares personal reflections on her class' experience during their three years of study at ACS. Sister Pascaline Musyoka, a native of Kenya and a member of the Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood offered this year's remarks. Sister Pascaline concluded with, "Yes the corona pandemic has imparted uncertainty but we hope the future holds the best moments for each one of us and so, with hearts filled with gratitude, we ask the Lord to bless us with boldness as we join mother Mary in her canticle of praise blessing each and everyone in a particular way."

Sister Joseph Spring, ACS President, also addressed the graduates, "As you leave ACS for your 4 year college, I pray that you bring with you the lessons of mind and heart learned here at ACS:

That studying hard pays off in the end  
That cultural differences are to be cherished, not feared  
That you are loved by all for who you are  
That no matter what, God is in charge."

The plan was for a formal graduation to take place on May 31, Pentecost Sunday, thinking by then, Mass could be celebrated and commencement exercises could be held on a small scale level. However, due to Governor Murphy's announcement allowing in-person graduations beginning July 6, and insisting that people still be barred from hosting indoor gatherings of more than 10 people because of the pandemic, with no exemption for houses of worship, a plan for a Eucharistic Service was made. Although they weren't able to be present, our prayers and congratulations are also offered to the non-residential graduate and certificate earners.



At the conclusion, the graduates enjoyed a reception with refreshments delivered by various friends. Later that day, the Graduates prepared a festive evening meal and the first and second year students prepared a very entertaining and poignant program.

# Annual Caring Basket Gala 2020

If you have ever planned a wedding or major celebration, you know that it can take many months, perhaps even a year of preparation. Reserving the venue, coordinating calendars, printing invitations, setting up a website, are just a few of the details! Planning Assumption College for Sisters Annual Caring Basket Gala was no different. Then, two weeks before the Gala, scheduled for March 26, 2020, the College made the difficult decision to cancel the event due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Additionally, cancelling this major funding event, which was in the planning for more than a year, threatened financial consequences for the College.

However, the Gala Committee and honorees agreed that the benefactors desired to see the mission funded, despite the physical event being cancelled. True to the spirit of generosity of Blessed Pauline von Mallinckrodt, each of the Gala's approximately 300 attendees graciously donated the ticket back to the College. The commitment to the mission from the College's donor base is astounding.

Within two weeks, the Gala Committee managed to set-up an online platform for the auctions, marking the first attempt for such an undertaking. The auctions were a great success. Happily, the "virtual" gala raised \$140,000 with additional pledges made.

Despite the change in plans, those who believe in the mission of Assumption College for Sisters were united in spirit. The College was able to recognize the honorees for their service to the Church and the community. Reflecting on these blessings, Sister Joseph Spring stated, "Our honorees and many others who supported us, participate in God's divine providence. The spirit of Blessed Pauline lives on in them and in the mission of Assumption College for Sisters. May Mary, health of the sick, be our strength."

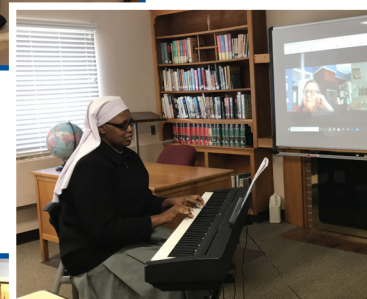
