### **New President for ACS**

Sister Joseph Spring, SCC has served as President of ACS for the past 14 years: the second longest-serving president in the history of the College. As part of the long-range planning between the SCC leadership team and the ACS Board of Trustees, succession planning has been a priority. Sister Joseph has met with Provincial Leadership and has indicated her desire and willingness to move on at the conclusion of the 2022-23 academic year into a new phase of her life's journey. When Sister Joseph began as President in 2009, she often said, "If the College does well, it is because we stand on the shoulders of giants." Now, as Sister Joseph gets ready to step down as President, the College would like to say to her, "Thank you Sister, for filling their shoes!" The entire ACS community is grateful to Sister Joseph for navigating the College's move out of the Motherhouse and providing the leadership needed to move toward financial independence. Under Sister Joseph's tenure a fiscally responsible Board of Trustees, as well as dedicated committees and an army of volunteers, were formed to effectively and efficiently oversee the needs of the College. Sister Joseph also guided us successfully through our last Middle States accreditation, and is currently acting as both our liaison and organizational mentor as we begin the College's seventh Middle States accreditation. ACS will be forever grateful to Sister Joseph for her leadership, stewardship, and tireless example of faith in action.

### **ACS Begins MSCHE Self-Study Process**

Assumption College for Sisters has begun the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) Self-Study, a two-and-a-half-year process that will provide an opportunity to engage in an in-depth, comprehensive, and reflective assessment of ACS. In addition to demonstrating compliance with the MSCHE standards and requirements, the self-study process will also identify opportunities for improvement and innovation.

The self-study Steering Committee is co-chaired by Sister Teresa Bruno, SC, and Dr. Jo Ann Sylva. Other members of the Steering Committee include Patricia McGrady, Treasurer, Jean Wedemeier, Information Technology Administrator, and Barbara Kelly-Vergona, Registrar. Faculty members Henry Crouse and Mara Marino are co-members of the Steering Committee and Sister Joseph Spring, SCC is the Accreditation Liaison Officer (ALO). The Steering Committee completed several professional development plenary sessions with MSCHE and is preparing for a visit from our VP Liaison, Dr. Paul Starkey, on March 14th, 2023. A draft of the Self-Study design will detail the self-study report, working group structure, timeline, communication plan, team profile evaluation, and strategy for evidence inventory. Working groups will include representation from the faculty, Board of Trustees, committee members, students, and alumni.

Many ACS stakeholders will be invited to become involved in the self-study process over the next two and a half years. Please keep us in prayer as we continue this important endeavor with the expected outcomes of re-accreditation and continuous improvement.

### **Honorary Doctoral Degrees Awarded**
