Education Award: Sister Joseph Spring, SCC



Sister Joseph Spring, SCC, our Caring Basket Gala honoree for the Education Award, is well known by many of our benefactors.

Sister has generously and successfully served ACS for fourteen years as its 6th President. During these years, Sister, together with Sister Marie Cecilia Landis, SCC, steered the College from Mendham to Denville and contained the spread of Covid. For this, and so much more, Sister justly deserves the Education Award.

Born in New Britain, Connecticut, Sr. Joseph grew up with her sister, Mary Ann, in Kensington. After spending her early educational years in several two-room public schools, she reluctantly went to St. Paul's

Jr. High School, staffed by the Sisters of Christian Charity, and after a few short weeks, was "sold" on the Sisters and Catholic education. One Sister had a particular influence on her, remembering the kindness and understanding the Sister had for the students from public schools.

In 1960, Sister entered the Sisters of Christian Charity, Mendham, New Jersey, as an Aspirant (aspiring to be an SCC) and received admission into the novitiate in 1964. Sister Joseph received an A.A. from ACS, a B.A. from Marillac College, and a M.A. from Seton Hall University. Sister celebrates her Jubilee this year as an SCC for 60 years.

Sr. Joseph is a strong supporter of Catholic education. She is proud she was a teacher most of her life, with 10 years of classroom teaching; 19 years as principal, 5 years as Assistant Superintendent in the Diocese of Paterson, 8 years as Provincial Councilor, and 14 years as President of ACS.

Through the years, Sister received numerous awards. To name a few: National Catholic Educational Association's Distinguished Principal Award, Honorary Doctorate, St. Vincent College, Latrobe, PA. Named National Distinguished Principal in 1993 and awards received in honor of her commitment to Holocaust Studies are her most treasured.

With respect to these assignments and awards, Sister Joseph says, "I especially loved working in the Diocesan Schools Office where I led the writing of curriculum and helped faculty implement it.
