Assumption College for Sisters Commencement 2024

On Saturday, May 11, Assumption College for Sisters held Commencement ceremonies as seven students earned AA degrees and five students were awarded the Certificate in Theological Studies. Commencement exercises took place at St. Mary's Church, Denville, following a Mass concelebrated by the pastor of St. Mary's Church and ACS Board of Trustee, Rev. Martin Glynn. Concelebrating were Rev. James Termyna, Rev. Rick Hardy, Rev. Christopher Ciccarino of the Diocese of Paterson, Rev. Peter Tran of the Diocese of Metuchen and assisted by Deacon Mike Allgaier, Deacon Jim Rizos, and Deacon Jack Flynn of St. Mary's Parish and Deacon Joseph Ho of the Diocese of Metuchen. A reception, courtesy of the parish, followed in the Riverview School Annex Auditorium to celebrate the graduates and certificate recipients.



Sister Kathryn Clauss, IHM, President of the Sister Servants of the Immaculate Conception, Scranton, PA., delivered the Commencement Address. After entering the IHM congregation, Sister received a BA in Education, and Master's in Counseling from Marywood, and a Ph.D. in Marriage and Family Therapy from Seton Hall University.

Sister Kathryn Clauss, IHM Sister has devoted much of her ministry and professional endeavors to the cause of education, serving as teacher, vice principal, and principal in elementary schools and teaching in the Psychology and Counseling Programs at Marywood University. After serving in various leadership roles within her community.

ACS is grateful to Marywood University for granting scholarships to our graduates. Sister Kathryn's message was both poignant and powerful: "In the days ahead you may find yourselves missioned in new educational settings, new ministries, new communities. You will realize the need the world has for you and realize the great gifts you

bring to the world through your academic preparation, your vowed life lived with passion, and your heartfelt respect for God's people."

A highlight of ACS' graduation program each year is a brief talk by one of the graduates who reflects on her class' experiences during the three years of study at the College. This year's address was presented by Sister Mary Marietha Kimaro, a member of the Holy Spirit Sisters of the Apostolic LIfe Society in Tanzania. Sister Mary Marietha thanked the administration, faculty, trustees, benefactors, tutors, and friends as well as the Sisters of Christian Charity for the gift of an education at ACS which they could not access in their countries. Sister noted that the graduates of 2024 represent all of the previous ACS graduates who passed through God's hands and "now spread throughout the nations." In conclusion, Sister addressed the class of 2024 proclaiming, "Let us go, Sisters, our future and our dreams are waiting for us...the world is thirsty for our knowledge!"

After the Commencement Ceremony, Mayor Thomas Andes of Denville awarded each graduate a proclamation declaring her an "Honorary Citizen of Denville."

ACS HONORS 2024 ALUMNA OF THE YEAR

Congratulations to Sister Carol Schuyler, SCC for being awarded the 2024 Alumna of the Year. Born and raised in Reading, PA, Sister Carol was taught by the Sisters of Christian Charity at St. Paul's Elementary School and at Reading Central Catholic High School. After graduation in 1966 she decided to enter the SCCs.

Sister graduated from Assumption College for Sisters in 1970 and then traveled to Marillac College in St. Louis to receive a BA in Social Studies. In 1988, Sister earned a Master's degree in History from the University of Scranton, PA.

For over 50 years, Sister Carol has been an educator. She has taught in various PA high schools including Delone Catholic, Bishop Hogan (now Holy Redeemer), Reading Central Catholic (now Berks Catholic), and is currently teaching at Bishop McDevitt High School in Harrisburg, PA. Although Sister Carol has taught in various content areas within secondary education, she is primarily a history teacher.

Beginning in 2015, Sister began teaching various history courses at ACS and continues to teach, *The Church: It's Nature and History* each summer. Sister Carol also co-presented for the Fall 2023 Lecture Series: *Honoring the Seasons of Life* on American Indigenous Peoples' History and Spirituality. Everyone at ACS is grateful to Sister Carol who took time off from her teaching responsibilities to serve as the Interim Assistant to the President and also assist with student services during the fall semester of 2023.

Sister Carol says about teaching at the college: "I enjoy teaching History any chance I get, especially Church History. I am always in awe of the international Sister students at ACS for all they do to study in English, living in a totally new culture while living and working with Sisters from different countries and cultures." 
