## Education Award: Rev. Msgr. Eugene (Geno) Sylva, S.T.D.



Rev. Msgr. Geno Sylva, S.T.D., a dedicated servant of the Church, was ordained in 1993 and currently serves as the Rector of the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Paterson, New Jersey. In addition to his pastoral duties, he is the *Episcopal Vicar for Special Projects* for the Diocese of Paterson. Msgr. Geno is deeply involved in his community, sitting on the Board of the Paterson Prep Charter School as one of its founding members. He also serves as Chaplain for the Paterson Police and Fire Departments, the Passaic County Sheriff's Department, and the New York Division of the FBI.

A highly educated theologian, Msgr. Geno holds a B.A. in Psychology from the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Massachusetts. He studied at the Seminary of the American College in Louvain, Belgium receiving a BA in Sacred Theology (STB) from the Catholic University of Louvain. Msgr. Geno then furthered his studies in Rome, earning both a Licentiate and Doctorate in Dogmatic Theology at the University of St. Thomas Aquinas. Throughout his career, he has held numerous roles within the Diocese of Paterson, including teacher, coach, chaplain, and president of DePaul Catholic High School. Additionally, he is the founder of *Young Prophets Teen Outreach* in Paterson.

Msgr. Geno was also the founding director of *St. Paul Inside the Walls*, the Catholic Center for Evangelization. From 2012 to 2018, he served as the *Episcopal Vicar for Evangelization* in the Diocese of Paterson, and later traveled to Rome to serve as the English Language Official for the *Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization* at the Vatican. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him as a member of the *Dicastery for Evangelization* at the Holy See, reflecting his commitment to the mission of evangelization.

A steadfast advocate for Assumption College for Sisters, Msgr. Geno believes passionately in its mission of educating and forming religious sisters, viewing it as integral to the success of the New Evangelization. Through his leadership and service, he continues to inspire those around him to embrace and carry out the Church's mission with dedication and zeal.
