September 23: HOPE IN THE SCRIPTURES

Presenter: Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli

Bishop Serratelli's lecture will surround the teachings and understandings of the virtue of hope within the writings of Scripture. A question/answer session may follow the lecture.

Bishop Serratelli, Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of Paterson, is a noted Scripture scholar, writer, and lecturer. He studied Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University and Scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute.
